Cooperative Agreement Regarding:
Aviation A.S.**

Air Traffic Control, Business Aviation, Professional Pilot

This agreement has been entered into by Inver Hills Community College and Metropolitan State University (First College) for the benefit of students and prospective students at the two institutions. The purpose of the agreement is to insure programs of high academic quality, to encourage student achievement, to facilitate the transfer of course credits and to provide a smooth transition from one related degree program to another.

Joint Admission

Students may be jointly admitted to both institutions. With joint admissions, students:

1. are guaranteed a place in Metropolitan State University's First College, upon transfer from Inver Hills Community College Aviation Programs;
2. can concurrently enroll in courses at both institutions;
3. can apply appropriate lower division credits, including those awarded through Competence Based Education, with a grade of better than "D" (or the equivalent), toward Metropolitan State University degree requirements;
4. will have access to program advisors at both institutions; and
5. will have any other rights and privileges of students at both institutions and will be sent mailings from both institutions.

Program Articulation

1. For graduation, students will need to complete a total of 124 semester credits including at least 41 upper division credits. A minimum of 30 semester credits must be completed while at Metropolitan State University.
2. The courses required for the Aviation Programs at Inver Hills Community College and their relationship to Metropolitan State requirements are listed in Attachments A, B and C.

- 3. Students with an Associate of Arts degree from a MnSCU institution or students who have completed the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum do not have to complete any additional general education requirements.
- 4. Community college courses will be accepted toward meeting Metropolitan State University general education requirements consistent with Attachments A, B and C. Attachments also include recommendations for general education curriculum at the community college.
- 5. All Metropolitan State students must complete eight upper-division credits of liberal studies course work.

Other Cooperative Agreements

- 1. Faculty at both institutions will cooperate in scheduling course offerings in a convenient, flexible manner. The resources of both institutions, including faculty and space, will be used in a manner that enhances the educational opportunities available to students.
- 2. When appropriate, each institution will offer jointly sponsored courses – courses taught by faculty from one institution but listed in the schedule of both institutions.
- 3. Unless otherwise arranged, any tuition, fees, and state appropriation will be paid to the institution from which the student takes a course.
- 4. Both institutions will work together to develop registration and financial aid procedures to facilitate concurrent enrollment of students.
- 5. At the end of each semester, each institution will forward to the other institution copies of transcripts from students in this program.
- 6. Both institutions will inform potential students about this program through their catalogs and a program brochure to be jointly developed.

Duration of Agreement

This agreement becomes effective upon the date it is signed and remains in effect until terminated by either party. It may be terminated or amended for succeeding academic years by either institution on or before June 30 of each year.

Persons Responsible/Evaluation

The dean of the First College at Metropolitan State University and the Aviation Program Director at Inver Hills Community College will be responsible for implementing this articulation agreement. Each institution will conduct an outcomes assessment, and the persons responsible will meet regularly to review the agreements.
