

**PARAMEDIC MOBILITY TRACK TO ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING CHECK LIST**  
**REVIEW BEFORE APPLYING**

Only graduates of a state approved Paramedic Program with a minimum grade of C or higher in EVERY course may apply to the Mobility Track. All applicants must be certified as a Nationally Registered Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic (NREMT-P) or State Certified as an EMT-P. Applicants must have an active license (license may be in any state in the U.S.). Applicants must have equivalent of one year full time work experience as a paramedic which will be verified by employer. The one year full time paramedic work experience must be completed before the first nursing courses Nursing 1260/1265, not by the date of submitted application. √

**ASSESSMENT CLARIFICATION:** College applicants are required to take the assessment inventory in English, Reading and math. **IMPORTANT:** All remedial/development coursework determined by assessments must be completed by the application deadline. Applicants must have completed Math 90 or assessed into a higher math level.

Applicants who have current assessments on file at Inver Hills (within two years) or have completed a college level English and math with a C or higher have met this requirement. Transfer applicants who have earned a C or higher in a college level English composition course and a college level math course are exempt from the English and math assessment for this program.

Students with a previous Bachelor's Degree from an English speaking country are exempt from the Reading Comprehension, and Writing English assessment. If previous transcripts reflect a college level math course (Inver Hills Math 1101/Century Math 1025 or higher) with a minimum grade of C these applicants are also exempt from the math assessment.

International applicants are required to take the English, Math & Reading assessment. Foreign transcripts must be evaluated by World Education Service (W.E.S.) [info@wes.org](mailto:info@wes.org) or (212) 966-6311
