

Classroom materials for educators: no copyright strings attached:

1. **Learning object repositories.** These free, online, searchable collections offer “learning objects” to faculty and students in non-profit, educational settings. Learning objects include policy guides, simulations, tutorials, scholarly papers, and multi-media presentations. The terms under which the learning objects may be used vary from object to object but, in most cases, no royalties or permissions are required for classroom use.
2. **Open course ware (OCW).** Open course ware sites are offered by colleges and universities from around the world. They offer free and open access to high quality educational materials, organized as courses. Course information may be downloaded and adapted for classroom use by teachers and students. 3. **Creative Commons.** Creative Commons is sponsored by a non-profit group. It provides free tools that let authors, scientists, artists, and educators mark their creative work using a series of logos, thereby identifying the uses they allow others to make of their work. 4. **Open source software.** Open source computer software is free and, more importantly, may be studied, copied, modified, and redistributed. One popular source of open source software is GNU. GNU’s Free Software Directory has a specific education listing, with separate elementary and secondary education categories. GNU can be found at <http://www.gnu.org>.
5. **Open source course management systems.** These free computer software packages help educators create online learning communities. One such software package popular among educators is *Moodle*, a package that offers an array of features including forums, quizzes, blogs, wikis, surveys, and multi-lingual support.
